HIDDEN GROVE



The Backstory by Michael Davidson

This is a story in two parts. When Gertrude Pacific and I bought our house on Skookumchuk in 1993, one of the big selling points was the public forest in the back. No one seemed to know the status of the land. Gertrude was horrified to discover that it was crown forest land which Interfor planned to clear cut in the near future. Spurred into action, she began a furious effort to have the 55-acre section protected for recreation. She was soon joined by many in the community who successfully fought a campaign to have it designated as an "Interpretive Forest RecreationReserve" by the Ministry of Forests in 1994.

The second part of the story begins with a local resident sounding the 'logging alarm' by stringing survey tape along the part of Inlet Road that borders what became known as the Hidden Grove in 2000. Its protection took far longer but with Bob D'Arcy helping to spearhead the battle along with countless others from the community, progress began in 2006 when the Community Forest took over Interfor's tenure and put a moratorium on logging. Current projects include the new interpretive signage along Monty's Way provided by the Community Forest and the continuing trail upgrading by the Trailbuilders, a volunteer group who are responsible for building and maintaining the 16 km of trails.
